In 2008 a group of Cuban artists and musicians began looking for a centralized location in which art could be shown, which lead to the group's acquisition of the closed factory in 2010. The current location opened in February 2014.

Ald Havana



Old Havana or La Habana Vieja is the city-center and one of the 15 municipalities forming Havana, Cuba. It has the second highest population density in the city and contains the core of the original city of Havana. In 1982, Old Havana was inscribed in the UNESCO World Heritage List, because of its unique Baroque and neoclassical architecture, its fortifications, and its historical importance as a stop on the route to the New World. A safeguarding campaign was launched a year later to restore the authentic character of the buildings.





Callejon de Hamel is an absolute gem in the heart of the center of Havana. This vibrant alleyway is a hub of afro cuban art and culture, filled with colorful murals, sculptures and lively music. This colorful narrow alley is full of lively colorful murals, street art and sculptures made of found objects, such as bathtubs, hand pumps, and pinwheels. The energy and creativity that radiate from every corner are truly captivating, offering visitors to Cuba's capital a taste of the city's local art.

Since 1939, the Tropicana has been Cuba's defining cabaret show. MUSEO CASA DE ÁFRICA



Established in 1986, the Museo Casa de África is located in Old Havana and displays several African items and collections that are unique to Cuba. The museum has a very interesting collection of African sculture and other art pieces, most from regions of Africa where AfroCuban ancestors were taken as slaves.



The museum, which is also a temple, offers an exhibition that brings to life the Afro-Cuban deities with 32 life-size sculpture representations of Orishas. While the Afro-Cuban pantheon of gods consists of about 401 orishas, only the best known are represented here. With the help of a guide, the exhibit offers a simple and fascinating vision of the main deities that form the basis of this colorful earthly fate.



HAVANA INTERNATIONAL

Festival

The 40th Havana Jazz Festival offers days of spectacular concerts by top Cuban musicians set in stunning venues across Havana including the National Theatre, Fabrica de Arte Cubano, and the Museum of Cuban Art. The trip goes beyond the festival itself, providing exclusive private concerts in intimate settings (think private jazz clubs, rooftops, stunning villas), an opportunity to meet the musicians, and lively workshops and receptions with renowned Cuban artists.

MUSEO NACIONAL DE BELLAS ARTES DE LA HABANA



MUSEUM OF THE ORISHAS



CENTRO FIDEL CASTRO MUSEUM



Founded on February 23, 1913, the Museo Nacional de Bellas Artes de La Habana (or National Museum of Fine Arts of Havana) is a museum of fine arts that exhibits Cuban art collections from the colonial times up to contemporary generations. The museum consists of two buildings: one dedicated to Cuban art in the Palacio de Bellas Artes and one dedicated to the universal art, in the Palacio del Centro Asturiano.

The National Capitol of Cuba is a public edifice in Havana that was commissioned by Cuban president Gerardo Machado. Prior to the Cuban Revolution of 1959, the Congress was housed here, but later the building fell into disrepair. "El Capitolio" towers at just under 700 feet tall, and is often compared to the United States Capitol, but it is not a replica. Cubans will tell you that it is similar but bigger and much richer in detail.

The Centro Fidel Castro museum is housed in an elegant mansion in Havana's Vedado district. It showcases Castro's legacy and ideas, and presents the story of the 1959 Cuban Revolution, and includes vivid exhibits and gardens, an amphitheater and extensive library as well as a bookstore. Cuba's government believes the centre will help spread Castro's message to visitors to cement his revolutionary legacy.

EL ALJIBE



El Aljibe has been in operation for more than 70 years and is one of Havana's most symbolic Cuban Creole food restaurants. In addition to great food, the restaurant offers a private lounge and bars, plus a wine cellar which is considered among the largest in Cuba.





Dine at one of the most historic venues in Havana and enjoy the unforgettable, vibrant and extravagant spectacle -- the Grand Show "Habana de Fiesta", a fusion of Indo-American, Hispanic and African cultures, that led to the Cuban culture.



San Cristóbal Paladar encapsulates Cuba's culture and heritage. The Havana of the early 1950s is present in every corner of the palador and in the meticulous composition of each dish. This restaurant offers a visual experience derived from a family home that has been transformed into a living museum. The spacious venue is decorated to keep your eyes moving. Complimentary cigars after dinner are a unique touch.

Matanzas is located on the northern shore of the island of Cuba, on the Bay of Matanzas, east of the capital Havana and west of the resort town of Varadero. It is known for its poets, culture, and Afro-Cuban folklore, as well as being the birthplace of the music and dance traditions danzón and rumba. Matanzas is called the City of Bridges, for the 17 bridges that cross the three rivers that traverse the city (Rio Yumuri, San Juan, and Canimar). For this reason it is referred to as the Venice of Cuba. Matanzas was one of the regions that saw intensive development of sugar plantations during the colonial era. Consequently, many enslaved Africans were transported to support the sugar industry, particularly during the first half of the19th century- in fact, by 1841 enslaved Africans made up over 62% of the population. Due to the high number of the enslaved as well as free Afro-Cubans, its retention of African traditions is especially strange.

HABANA COMPAS DANCE



FUSTER ART COMMUNITY

Founded in 2004, Habana Compas was the living example of Cubanness, through the mixing of Afro-Cuban and contemporary rhythms with flamenco and other Spanish dances. However, the inclusion of percussion in their repertoire allowed the group to achieve the dream of being completely different from what was done in Cuban music and dance.

Fuster Art Community or Fusterlandia is now a destination for artists and visitors, but it began as an art installation in Cuba's Jaimanitas neighborhood. Created by Cuban artist Jose Rodriguez Fuster, the project was inspired by his time in Europe and public architecture projects like Gaudi's Park Guell. In 1976 Fuster began transforming his home into art, and over time, expanded it to include the entire neighborhood featuring colorful mosaics, sculptures and murals.

Salsa Dance

WORKSHOP

Salsa is a Latin American dance, associated with salsa music. It originated in Eastern Cuba and gained popularity in New York in 1960. It is a mixture of Cuban dances, such as mambo, pachanga, and rumba, as well as American dances such as swing and tap.



EL JARDIN DE LOS MILAGROS

This sweet restaurant is situated in a neighborhood. When you walk in you are surprised with a lush garden and beautiful atmosphere. The true experience of venturing into a magical garden. MUSEO DEL TABACO



The Museo del Tabaco (Tobacco Museum) is dedicated to the preservation and display of the plantations, production and commercialization process of Cuban tobacco. The museum has a collection of pipes and leaves along with the Casa Especializada del Habano, a small shop where you are able to purchase different Havana cigars and items for smokers.

HAVANA CLUB RUM MUSEUM



The Havana Club Rum Museum (Museo del Ron) offers a guided tour exhibiting the complex rummaking process in old machines. It explains the entire process, from the manufacturing white oak barrels to the rum's fermentation and aging process, a scale-model copy of a sugar mill, as well as a tasting. The museum also contains a bar and shop.

LA BARRACA



The newly renovated restaurant is located on the patio of Hotel Nacional offering spectacular views and a variety of international dishes, as well as a full menu of drinks and cocktails. Its the ideal great place to enjoy a relaxing.
